

Collective of the Families of the Disappeared in Algeria (CFDA) was created in 1998 in Paris by a group of victims' mothers, including Nassera Dutour and officially registered in June 1999 as an association upon French law. SOS Disparus is CFDA Algerian Section. It was created in 2001 and has offices in Algiers, Oran and Constantine. The two associations work nationally and internationally for the right of the families of disappeared to Truth and Justice. Their main objectives are to set up a process for establishing the Truth on a case-by-case basis for all the disappeared and the victims of the Algerian conflict in the 1990's, obtain a full compensation of the victims and prevent the repetition of the crime of enforced disappearance.
